




Treasurer

The Treasurer maintains MiVAC's financial accounts, produces monthly reports for the Trustees and advises on financial policy.

PR adviser

Someone who can write press releases and coordinate relations with local, regional and national media.

Membership committee

Volunteers coordinator

A member to implement our volunteer policy and to ensure volunteers meet all volunteer requirements.

Google Docs administrator

A member who can oversee the uploading and sharing of documents and calendars on Google Documents / Calendars and can assist members to learn how to use these resources.

All positions are of course voluntary and reflect MiVAC's current growth and future projects

needs.
