

More Minefields Around Ban

We thought there were 4 Minefields just North of the Road at Ban Xai. How wrong we are! Phoenix Clearance Limited were finishing off clearing K2 Minefield for MiVAC when they were told of 40 cattle having their leg blown off (and therefore being shot). Furthermore, in the rainy season, the locals could see the M14 Mines sticking out above the ground.

What we are doing about this is a longer range plan. Our plan is to call tenders to clear these minefieds one at a time (hopefully being supported by Rotary in WA) and the asking for assistance from Ausaid for finance.

News From The Field



Picture: A Sketch of a Biodigester System

One of the main aspects in the project at Ban Xai is the construction of biodigesters which will produce methane gas for cooking, heating and lighting and the processed product will be used for market gardens. Whilst Peter Moroney has developed a biodigester to be built at Ban Xai which is slightly different to the one above the essentials are the same.

Starting from the left of the picture you will see penned cattle. These cattle are penned at night so that their dung can be collected - and this along with pig dung is the raw material for the biodigester. The next picture shows the farmer mixing the dung with water and the entrance pipe leading to the bottom of the biodigester. As the dung enters the system there is also a discharge of the processed dung (being less dense) seen on the right hand side of the system.

In the system Methane Gas is given off and funnelled to those taps in the centre of the Dome. Then there is a piped system of gas running to the farmers house.

Now look at the right hand side of the picture. Notice the discharge of the processed dung being collected in a pit of some sort and then used on the market gardens at the extreme right of the picture.
