# **Vietnam Project Coordinator's Report** by Peter Perry

A Merry Xmas to all MiVACians and Friends of MiVAC.

In early 2017 I visited Quang Tri Province in Vietnam to carry out an initial feasibility study into the provision of running water to needy villages and schools. This visit was a culmination of some hard work and sound advice from a local, Ms Phuong, who provided a sound basis for our subsequent project development. After Brian completed the designs and budgets, we progressed to a funded proposal and were ready to start work in the Ba Tang Commune near Khe Sanh when COVID hit!

Now, with very few COVID cases in Vietnam, the time is nigh to commence our projects. The setup team is primed to arrive in Vietnam on 31 January 2023. Whilst there is much administrative work to complete in Dong Ha (the Quang Tri provincial capital) a key task revolves around identifying and setting up a MiVAC office/home in Khe Sanh. Our deployment is expected to last for at least 3 years.

My main task, however, is to secure the full-time services of a Vietnamese Administrative Manager (VAM), a key position to be located at our office in Khe Sanh. I have received 4 applications for this position to date with more anticipated. A very interesting adventure awaits us with many clean little faces as the ultimate reward.
